Senior Graduation Information

Commencement Ceremony

- Report to the cafeteria no later than 5:30pm.
- Be ready to line up, in order, wearing your cap and gown.
- Tickets must be handed in if the ceremony is inside. No one will be permitted into the auditorium without a ticket.

Gowns/Caps

- Dewrinkle your gown before the ceremony or hang in a steamed room to release the wrinkles. Maroon and Gray show all of the wrinkles. **Do NOT use a hot iron.** Steaming is the ideal method to get all of the wrinkles out of the gowns.
- Only the honors group wears cords during the ceremony. NHS and NTHS members can
 wear pins on their gowns. No other cords, pins or regalia are appropriate for the BAHS
 ceremony.
- CAPS Do not decorate or cover them. We are one class, so we look like one class.
- The cap should be flat (parallel to the ground) and pulled down on your forehead. Tassels are worn to the RIGHT side when entering the ceremony.
- Proper dress under your gown is polished, yet comfortable:
 - O Dress shoes, collared shirts, dress pants, skirts, dresses, etc. Remember that you will either be on the field or on stage. You should be able to walk comfortably in your shoes and outfit for that day.
 - Do not wear Athletic shoes, work boots, shorts, or jeans you will be asked to change.

Expectations

- Graduation is a formal, community event any "individual action" that takes away from the group is disrespectful to both your classmates and your guests.
- Please be respectful while in your cap and gown, and at all graduation-related events you are a representation and reflection of yourself, your family, and your school.
- The venue will be determined by Friday afternoon and is weather contingent.
- No gum ... please!
- As a reminder, applause during the ceremony and when names are announced is appropriate.
