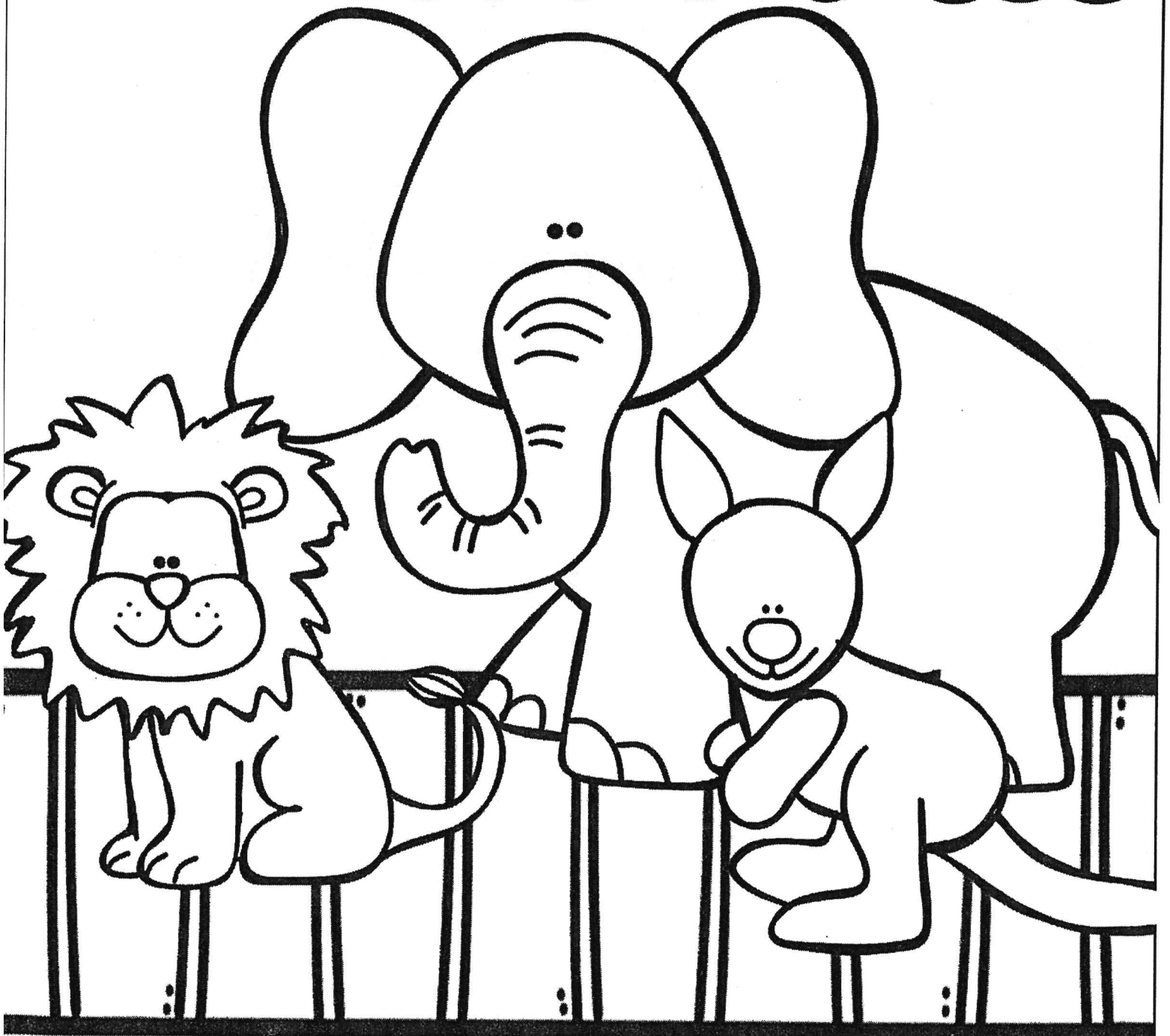


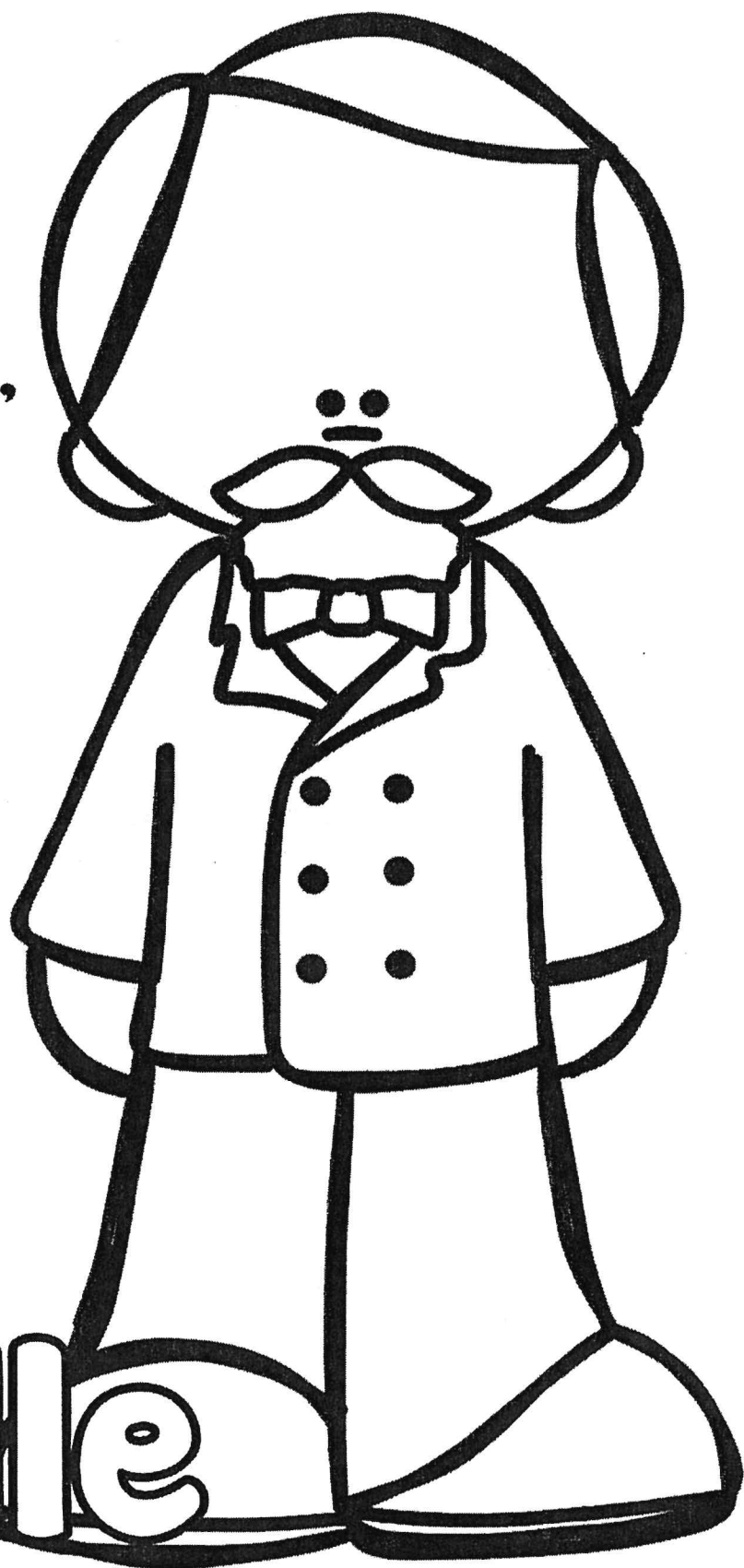
CARNIVAL of the Animals

sound like the tortoise.



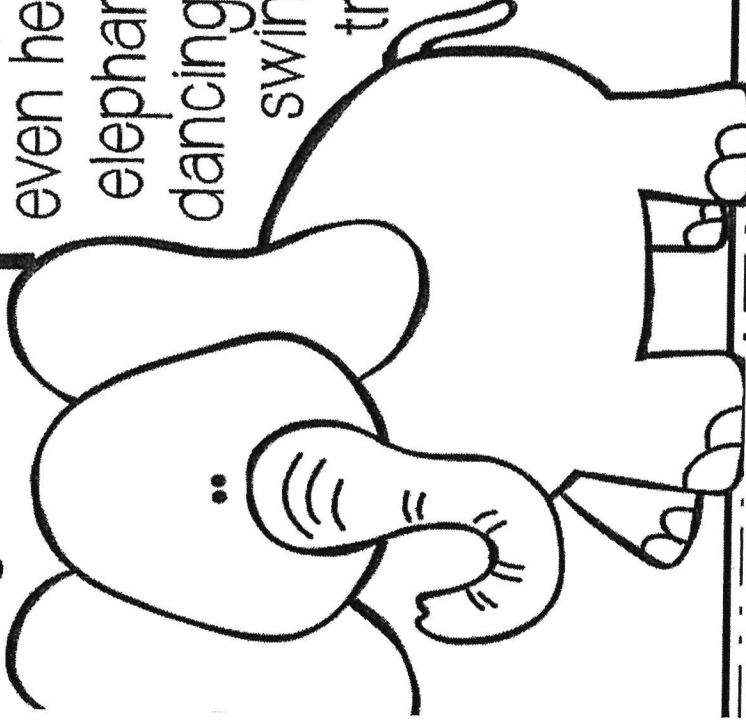

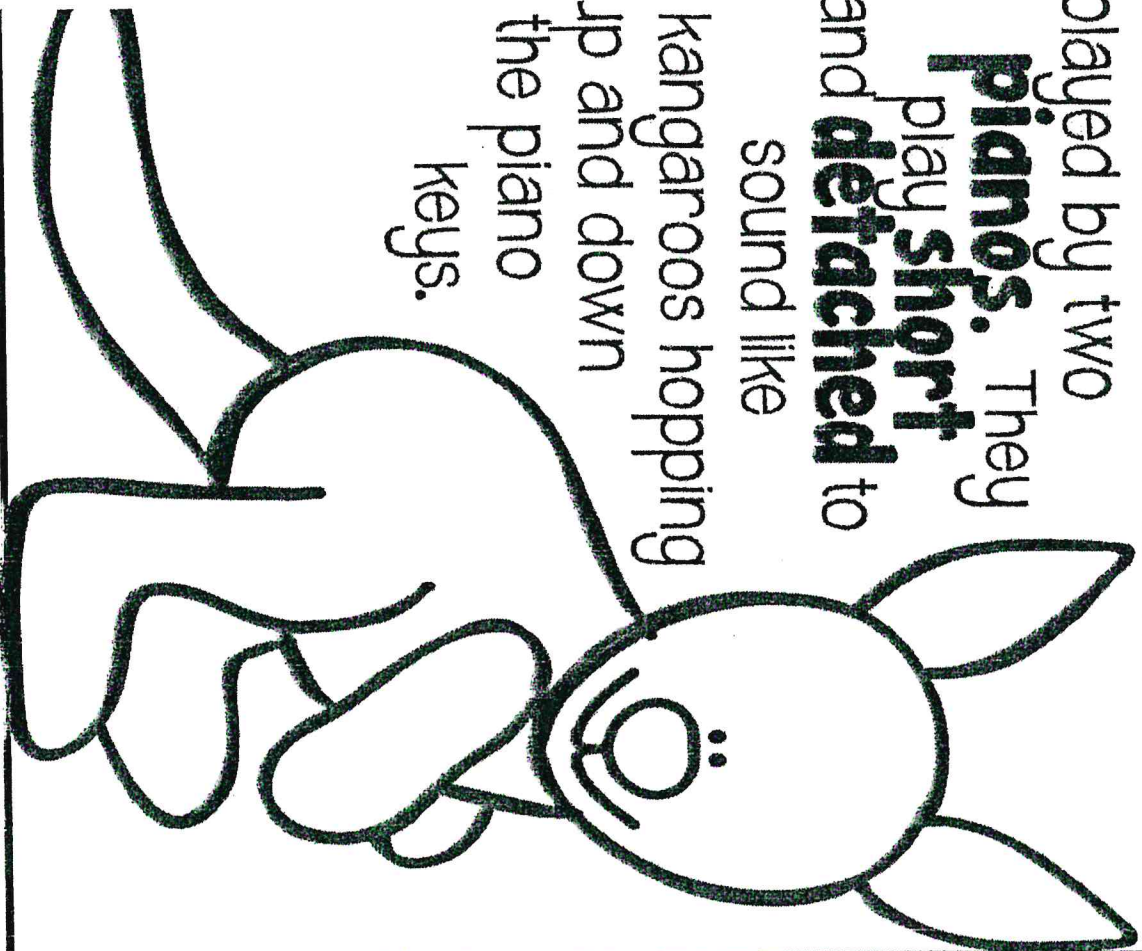
Kangaroos

sound like

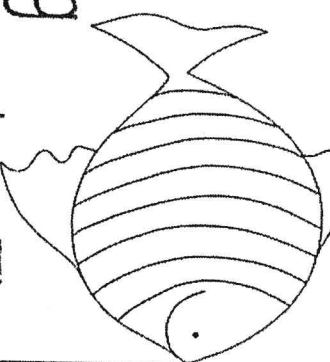
kangaroos hopping up and down the piano keys.

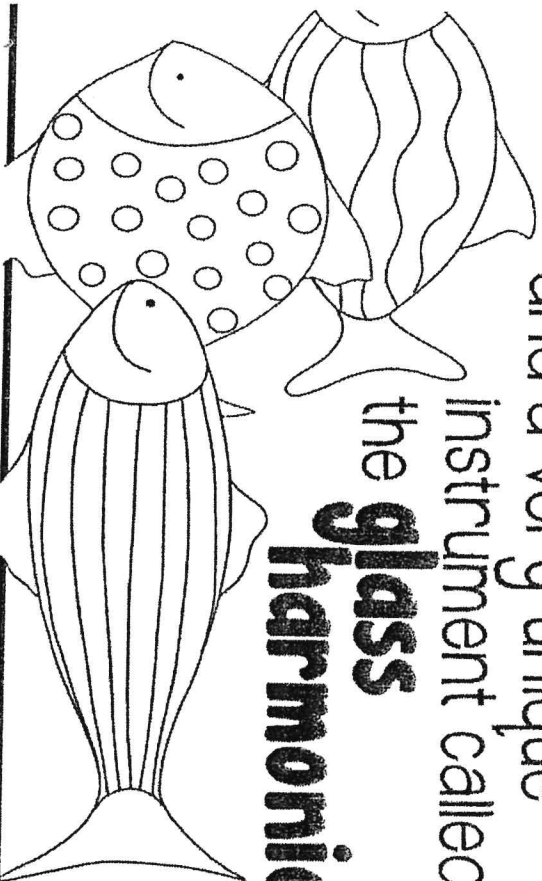
