<p>Journeys: Practice this week's High Frequency Words: ready, kinds, covers, country, earth, warms, soil, almost (If you can already read them, practice spelling them :)</p> <p><u>Timing recommendation:</u> Choose two days to practice the words. You may practice more if your child needs it. Here are some fun ways to practice your words if you would like: rainbow write, sidewalk chalk, write them in the air, make notecards, or write them in shaving cream/salt.</p>							

<p>View our weekly story online: A Tree is Plant Student Book We recommend viewing the student book for the story on a device.</p>							
<p>Reading: Read for a minimum of 15 minutes each day. You can use a book or an online resource, such as Raz-Kids or Pebble Go.</p>							
<p>Writing: Pick 2-3 days to answer the quick write questions. You also have the option for your child to respond each day. You can either send your child's responses to your child's teacher electronically (scan or picture) or type it in an email. Place an X on the days your child completed the quick writes.</p> <p>Each quick write should be 1-3 sentences and should focus on capitalization, punctuation, and grade level spelling and grammar. <p>Math:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> IXL can be used for extra practice, at your discretion. To best match this week's concepts, choose skills from <u>sections V and W</u>. View Polygons, Quadrilaterals, and/or Slides, Flip, and Turns on Brainpop Jr. Try the quizzes after the videos for extra practice. (You will need a free account to view these videos. Go to https://jr.brainpop.com/ and click request free access at the top. Choose Free Family Access to set your own account.) Virtual Manipulatives: this website offers many math manipulatives to explore. Current recommendations include using GeoBoards to build shapes or Pattern Blocks to build shape designs or pictures. Complete any of these supplemental pages that go with our current skills-math printables. Go on a shape hunt around your home or neighborhood! Look for circles, squares, rectangles, triangles, rhombuses, trapezoids, and hexagons along with spheres, cylinders, cubes, cones, pyramids, and rectangular prisms. <p>Science Ready for another science experiment? All you’ll need is food coloring, 2% or whole milk, a shallow bowl or dish, dish soap, and a Q-tip. Pour the milk into the bowl/dish and place several drops of each color of food coloring towards the center of the bowl (try to keep colors separated). Place the Q-tip in some dish soap and then submerge it into the milk/food coloring. Watch what happens!
