Number 1-Insects contain a hard shell or exoskeleton, so be sure your insect doesn't have any bones. Number 2-Your insect's body should contain 3 parts: a head, which contains its eyes, mouth, and antennae, a thorax, which contains the legs and sometimes wings, and the abdomen, which is where the insect digests food. The abdomen is also where you may find its stinger. Number 3-Your insect should have 6 legs. I wonder what your insect will look like? Will it have wings or a stinger? Will it be cute, creepy, big, small, slimey, colorful?....
