<p>Reading: Read for a minimum of 10 minutes each day (book or digital source).</p> <p>Listen to a selection from our reading series: Oscar and the Frog: A book about Growing</p>					
<p>Sight Words: Here are some review words. (If you have these words mastered, feel free to pick any 5 previous words that aren't saved to your child's brain).</p> <p style="text-align: center;">that here was will very</p> <p>Monday - Sight Word Mix Up - Get 3 cups or bowls. Have an adult or sibling hide one of the words underneath and mix them up. Try and guess which cup or bowl is hiding the word and then read the word.</p> <p>Tuesday - Sight Word Stomp - If outside, write words in sidewalk chalk and "stomp" from word to word reading it aloud. If inside, you can write them on sticky notes on the floor.</p> <p>Wednesday - Shower Steam - practice writing the words on the shower wall.</p> <p>Thursday - Hot and Cold - Have a family member hide a sight word somewhere in the room. Go look for it as they tell you whether you are hot or cold. Read the word when you find it!</p> <p>Friday - Free Choice Friday - Practice your sight words in your favorite way!</p>

Friday - I can break apart (decompose) and put together (compose) numbers to 8, using number sentences and drawings.
