Animal Adaptations: Behaviors

Instinct

- a behavior that an animal begins life with
- -adaptations that help animals meet their needs
- -Examples of **instincts** include <u>migration</u> and <u>hibernation</u>

<u>Migration</u> - the movement of a group of one type of animal from one region to another and back again

Examples of animals that migrate:

- -Atlantic green turtles (to lay eggs)
- -All kinds of birds, including the pectoral sandpiper (climate)
- -Gray whales (to give birth)
- -Pacific salmon (to lay eggs)
- -Monarch butterflies (climate)

<u>Hibernation</u> - a period when an animal goes into a long, deep "sleep"

Examples of animals that hibernate:

- -Ground squirrel
- -North American bats
- -Black bear
- -Frogs
- -Snakes

Learned Behaviors

- an activity that a creature is not born knowing how to do.

Examples of learned behaviors:

- -Tiger cubs watching their mothers to learn how to hunt
- -Chimps learning the meanings of sounds for communication
